According to the Organic Act on Prevention and Suppression of Corruption B.E. 2018, Section

128, paragraph one, prohibits any government official from receiving property or any other benefit that can be calculated as money from Who? In addition to assets or benefits that should be obtained according to laws, rules or regulations issued by virtue of having authority according to the provisions of the law Except for receiving property or any other benefits by Dhamma Ethics according to the criteria and limits. The amount specified by the NACC and the Code of Ethics for Police Officials

2021, Section 2 (2) Honest name Performing duties according to law Rules and regulations of the Royal Thai Police with transparency Do not show behavior that has implications for illegal exploitation. Be responsible for your human rights duties.

Be ready to receive inspection and take responsibility, have good conscience, be considerate of society and item 2(4).

Think about public benefits more than personal interests, have public spirit, cooperate, join together, and sacrifice in doing.

Benefits for the garden and creativity for the benefit and happiness of society. together with the plan to reform the country in terms of Prevent and suppress corruption and misconduct (Revised version sets out important reform activities. Activity 4: Develop the Thai bureaucratic system to be transparent. without benefit, goal number 1.1 for all fovernment agencies Announcement as an organization that all government officials do not accept gifts and gifts. Accepting all kinds of gifts from performing duties (No Gift Policy)

Therefore, in order to prevent conflicts between personal interests and public interests.

(Confict of Interest) Accepting bribes, gifts, favors, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties, Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station therefore to establish guidelines for anti-bribery practices (Anti-Bribery Policy) has the following details:

Objective: To

prevent or reduce the opportunity to receive bribes. Conflicts of interest in various forms

- 5. To determine guidelines for receiving entertainment fees. or gifts from executives and police officials under the jurisdiction of Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station in accordance with relevant laws and regulations.
- 6. To support and enhance operations Operated under the national strategy, master plan under national strategy and the national reform plan for preventing and suppressing corruption and misconduct. Including being part of the guidelines for evaluating morality and transparency in government agencies (Integrity and Transparency Assessment: ITA)

/ Scope...

Scope of application

Applies to all police officers under Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station.

Definition

"Bribe" means property or other benefits given to a person in order for that person to do or refrain from doing any act. holding a position whether it is legal or illegal As the bribe payer desires, including receiving gifts, favors, and facilitation fees. An instrument showing goodwill, accepting donations, receiving treats, and similar benefits. When there is a proposal, giving or receiving that can reasonably be considered as is a bribe and includes giving or receiving afterward

"Gifts, presents, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties" means money.

Property, services, or other benefits that are of value and are provided, including tips. Government officials receive in addition to salary, income, and government benefits in normal cases and affect decisions, approvals, permissions, or anything else in performing their duties in a manner that benefits the provider in a dishonest way. gifts from the past or at the time of receipt or in the future

"Property" means property and intangible objects. which may have a price and may be held, such as money, houses, cars,

stocks. "Receiving property or any other benefits in an ethical manner" means receiving property or Any other benefits from relatives or people given on different occasions1 Usually according to tradition or culture or given according to the etiquette practiced in

society. "Relatives" means parents, descendants, brothers and sisters. or sharing the same father or mother, uncle, aunt, spouse, ascendant or descendant of the spouse. Adopted child or adoptee "Other benefits" means things of value. including price reductions Receiving entertainment, receiving services, receiving training or anything else of the same nature

"Performing duties" means an action or performance of duties by a government official in an appointed position. or has been assigned to perform any duties or to act on behalf of the government in any duty, both general and specific, as an official. Surveys for which the law has specified authority and duties or are carried out according to the authority and duties specified by law to have authority. The authority and duties of the police:

"Commander" means a person who has authority to order, supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under his command.

"Subordinates" means All police officers under Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station, other than commanders. Guidelines for

preventing bribery

- 1. Civil servants are prohibited from Surveys under the sub-district station Every Nong Sanom Provincial Survey officer took part. involved in giving or receiving any form of bribe, whether directly or indirectly.
- Civil servants are prohibited from Surveys under the sub-district station All Nong Sanom Provincial
 Survey officers demand or receive Bribes for personal gain or

the benefit of others. 3. Follow the anti-corruption policy. without getting involved with Corruption, whether direct or indirect

4. Performing duties must strictly comply with regulations, police discipline, and related laws. 5. Do not do

anything that is considered giving or receiving a bribe. 6.

Supervise to ensure that 7. Receiving donations or financial support, whether in the form of money, objects, or property. For

any activity or project, regulations, rules, and announcements must be strictly followed. and have a receipt or evidence of Receive money to accompany the report every time. 8. Receiving property or any other benefits in accordance

with ethics, civil servants must Surveys under the station

All Nong Sanom Provincial Police officers Follow the announcement. The National Anti-Corruption Commission regarding the criteria for receiving property or other benefits based on the ethics of officials 2020 is strictly enforced.

Measures to manage policy violations

- 1. Failure to comply with this policy may result in disciplinary action or action. There will be no criminal proceedings or other related laws. Including direct supervisors who ignore the actions has committed a wrongdoing or is aware that a wrongdoing has been committed but has not taken corrective action which has disciplinary punishment up to the point of dismissal from government service
- Failure to be aware of this policy announcement and/or related laws cannot be used as An excuse for not complying is allowed.
- 3. Supervisors according to the Order of the Police Department No. 1212/1994, dated 1 October 1994, have the authority and responsibility to supervise subordinates under their supervision to adhere to and comply with the policy. Like this **strictly**

Monitoring measures

- 1. Station commander Nong Sanom Provincial Survey announces its intention The intention is to manage the agency with honesty, integrity, transparency and in accordance with the principles of good governance. By disseminating the information to police officers under their jurisdiction and external stakeholders.
- 2. Commanding officers according to Police Department Order No. 1212/1994, dated October 1, 1994, shall have the authority and duties to: Supervising, following up and inspecting officials Surveying subordinates who are under supervision and under their control must conduct themselves in accordance with this announcement. In the event that an action is found actions that violate this announcement Report to the Superintendent of Nong

Sanom Provincial Police Station as soon as possible. 3. Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station arranges for review and improvement of compliance guidelines. Appropriateness or according to

changes in various factors that are significant. 4. Have the Administration Department of Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station prepare statistics on bribes or gifts or other benefits. from performing duties along with problems and obstacles, reported to the Superintendent of Nong Sanom Provincial Police Station every quarter.

Measures to protect complainants/informers and maintain confidentiality

1. When considering complaints, determine the level of secrecy and protect those involved according to

regulations. By maintaining government secrets, 2001, and submitting matters to the agency for consideration. Information providers and Complaints may get into trouble, such as complaints against government officials that are initially considered to be business secrets. If it's

a cool business card Consider only the cases with specified evidence. The circumstance is clearly evident and only certain witnesses can be

identified. Reporting information on influential people must conceal the name and address of the complainant. If the name and address of the

petitioner is not concealed, the relevant agencies must be informed and provide protection to the petitioner as follows: "Let the commander use

his discretion to give orders. Taking reasonable steps to protect the complainant, witnesses, and persons who provide information in the

investigation. Don't you have to suffer? Injustice that may result from complaints being a witness or providing that information" in the case

where the name of the victim is specified The accusation must protect both the complainant and the respondent. Because the matter has not

yet gone through the fact-checking process. And it may be bullying and accusations that will cause suffering and damage. and in the case

where the complainant specifies in the request to conceal or does not wish to disclose the name of the complainant The agency must not reveal

the name of the complainant to the responding agency. Know this because the complainant may have

suffered as a result of the complaint. 2. When making a complaint The complainant and witnesses will not be subject to any action that affect

or livelihood, if any action is necessary, such as separating the workplace working to prevent the complainant Witnesses

and the accused meet together, etc. Must receive consent from the complainant and the witness.

3. Requests from the injured party, the complainant, or witnesses, such as requests to move workplaces

or methods of Preventing or solving problems Should be considered by the responsible person or agency as appropriate.

Protect the complainant from being bullied.

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
